

Bristol Grammar School 'A' level Results 2019

Students at Bristol Grammar School have achieved some excellent examination results.

There was a 100% pass rate, including 37 students who achieved three or more A*/A grades, with thirteen of them gaining three or more A*s. All eleven pupils holding Oxbridge offers met them; they will go on to study a diverse range of exciting courses such as English and French, Chemistry, History, Maths and PPE (Philosophy, Politics and Economics).
